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## 1. INTRODUCTION

### 1.1 Status of the University

Aliah University is an autonomous university under the Department of Minority Affairs and Madrasah Education, Government of West Bengal. It has started its glorious journey from the academic session 2008-09 with great potential and immense opportunities. It has been declared as a minority institution vide G.O. No. 1465-MD/07 dated 12.10.2007 by the Government of West Bengal and empowered to award degrees as specified by the UGC under Section 22 of UGC Act, 1956 vide letter No. F.9-29-2008(CPPP-1) dated 23.12.2008.

### 1.2 A flashback to the Past

Mohammedan College of Calcutta, popularly known as Madrasah-i-Aliah or Calcutta Madrasah is the first educational institution set up in India in 1780 by Warren Hestings, the then Governor General of East India Company. Calcutta Madrasah was established chiefly for the study of the Arabic and Persian languages and Muslim Law so that the sons of the Muslim gentry could perform the duties as officers for running the revenue administration and judiciary. The Naib Nizam was instructed to recruit the students of the Madrasah as vacancies occurred in the Fauzdari Courts, on production of certificates of efficiency.

However, within a decade Arithmetic, Algebra, Geometry, Astronomy, Islamic Theology, Oriental Studies, Natural Philosophy, Geological Studies, Law, Logic, Rhetoric, Grammar, and Oratory were added to the list of prescribed subjects for study. In 1821, the Annual Examination of the Madrasah was held in the presence of many respectable officials and gentlemen of Calcutta. This was the first public examination held in British India. A medical class, headed by Dr Breton, Professor of Medicine, was started at this Madrasah in 1826 for the first time in British India. Dr Breton was authorized to purchase a skeleton and collect medical books. An anatomical work published by John Taylor was arranged to be translated into Arabic. The medical class continued here till the establishment of Calcutta Medical College in 1836. However, the students of the Madrasah were allowed to study medicine at Calcutta Medical College. This speaks for the high standard of education at the Madrasah in those days. Also, the curricula taught at this institution were a blend of theological studies, natural sciences and the humanities, as was done in the world-wide madrasah system of education which produced the galaxy of scholars who made original contributions to astronomy, mathematics, chemistry, physics, medicine, geology, art & architecture, and so on. The authorities tried to introduce English as a subject for study in 1826. But, not many students were found willing to learn English, as Persian was still the medium of administration in India. But in 1837 the colonial government replaced Persian with English as the official language. So the Anglo-Arabic Department was opened at the Madrasah in 1839 for the teaching of English. At the recommendation of a Committee, again in 1854, this Anglo-Arabic Department was abolished and an English school, in the name of Anglo-Persian Department, was started under the direct control of the Principal of Calcutta Madrasah. The great reformist Nawab Abdul Latif (1828-1893), a product of Calcutta Madrasah, played an important role in the establishment of this Department so that Muslim children could receive the much-needed English education.

After the Great Rebellion or the so-called 'Sepoy Mutiny' of 1857, the British rulers began to have a suspicious attitude to the Muslims. Questions were raised regarding the maintenance of Calcutta Madrasah at Government cost. There were proposals to abolish the Madrasah, at least the Arabic Department, retaining only the Anglo-Persian Department. However, in 1860, the Government of India, rejecting the idea of abolition, rather recommended improvement in its management. So the Madrasah continued to exist. In 1869, a Committee consisting of C.H. Campbell, Commissioner of the Presidency Division, I. Suitcliff, Principal of Presidency College, and Nawab Abdul Latif, then a Deputy Magistrate, was formed to inquire into the affairs of the Madrasah and suggest improvement. Some reforms were introduced at the Calcutta Madrasah according to the suggestions of this committee. Further reforms were introduced at the recommendations of the Education Commission headed by W.W. Hunter in 1884. Nawab Abdul Latif and Justice Syed Amir Ali



played a very important role in these reforms. In 1896, Elliot Hostel was founded, with funds raised out of donations from the public, for the accommodation of the Madrasah students who so far had used the ground floor of the Madrasah as their hostel. In 1902 the Muslim Institute was established as a part and parcel of Calcutta Madrasah. The Principal of the Madrasah was ex-officio President and Treasurer of the Muslim Institute. Several committees and commissions were appointed in 1915, 1923, 1931, 1938-40, and 1946 for the improvement in the syllabi, curricula, and all round development of Madrasah education in Bengal, particularly of Calcutta Madrasah.

Calcutta Madrasah was upgraded to Calcutta Madrasah College and then to Aliah University by the Government of West Bengal through Aliah University Act XXVII of 2007 passed in West Bengal Legislative Assembly.

### 1.3 Present and Future of the University

In addition to the existing Kamil and M. M. courses in Islamic Theology and 3-year Honours courses in Arabic, Aliah University introduced 5-year integrated M.A. in English, 5-year integrated M.Sc. in Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Statistics, Geography, 4-year B.Tech. in Computer Science & Engineering, Electronics & Communication Engineering, Electrical Engineering and Civil Engineering, 2-year M.A. in English and 2-year M.Sc. in Geography from 2009, and from the Academic Session 2010-11, it has introduced 4-year B.Tech. in Mechanical Engineering, 2-year M.A. in Bengali and History.

The University, in collaboration with Techno India Group, introduced 5-year integrated programmes in Computer Science (M.Sc.), Computer Application (MCA), Business Administration (MBA) and also 2-year M.A./M.Sc. in Journalism & Mass Communication (M.JMC) from the academic session 2008-09. From the Academic Session 2010-11, 5-year integrated M.Sc. in Computer Science course is being conducted by the Dept. of Computer Science & Engineering of the University itself. The MBA, MCA and M.JMC courses are still running in collaboration with Techno India Group.

Besides the old existing premises of erstwhile Calcutta Madrasah College at 21, Haji Md. Mohsin Square, Kolkata 700016 which is mainly used to conduct the courses on Arabic and Islamic Theology, all other courses in Engineering, Science and Humanities run by the University are being held at Maulana Azad Bhawan at DD-45, Salt Lake, Kolkata 700064, and four other buildings at DN-41, DN-47, EN-68 and EN-69, Sector V, Salt Lake, Kolkata 700091. The main administrative sections of the University are working from the addresses DN-41, and DN-47, Sector V, Salt Lake, Kolkata 700091. The University is going to build a beautiful, sprawling, state-of-the-art campus of its own on a land measuring 20 acres at Newtown, Rajarhat, which has been allotted to it by the Government of West Bengal, very recently. In the mean time, another campus of the University, consisting of two eleven-storied high risers, is being constructed at 17, Gorachand Road (behind Lady Brabourne College), Park Circus, Kolkata.

### 1.4 Vision and Mission of the University

Aliah University is marching on with a vision to recapture the ambience and dynamic cultural heritage of the Madrasah system, to expand and deepen it, to evolve it further with a successful outreach into the emerging areas in each branch of modern science, technology, social studies, and humanities. It aims to instill the dynamism of its glorious heritage of the past among all its students, so that they can successfully cope with the critical needs and challenges of the present and contribute to the future advancement of science, technology, and human civilization. It also hopes to develop in its students the love and respect for the fellow citizens of the country and to cherish the ideals of secularism and national integrity.



### 1.5 A Special Feature

The University being a minority institution, and having a rich heritage of Islamic Culture, it is expected that all students of the University shall have some basic minimum knowledge of Arabic and Islamic Studies. For that reason, the students of 4/5-year courses have to take four compulsory subjects, viz., Elementary Arabic - I, Elementary Arabic - II, Islamic Studies - I and Islamic Studies - II in the first four semesters of their curricula. Students of 2-year programmes, however, shall have to take one Elementary Course in Arabic and another in Islamic Studies in the first two semesters of their curricula. Students having already studied these subjects as part of their Secondary and Higher Secondary curricula will be offered suitable alternative subjects in lieu of them.

However, English being internationally accepted as a medium of communication, medium of instruction followed in the University is English, except the language subjects.

### 1.6 Motto of the University

The motto of the University is "Advancement of Education and Culture." In Arabic, "Taqdeem-ut-Ta'leem wa-asSaqafah."

## 2 COURSES

Except the Arabic and Islamic Theology courses, admissions to all other courses run by the University are made through Aliah University Admission Test (AUAT). The AUAT-2012 will be taken in three different groups as given below.

### Group A

1. 4-year B. Tech. in Civil Engineering (CEN),
2. 4-year B. Tech. in Computer Science & Engineering (CSE),
3. 4-year B. Tech. in Electronics & Communication Engineering (ECE),
4. 4-year B. Tech. in Electrical Engineering (EEN),
5. 4-year B. Tech. in Mechanical Engineering (MEN),
6. 5-year integrated MCA,
7. 5-year integrated M.Sc. in Chemistry (with specialization in Medicinal Chemistry),
8. 5-year integrated M.Sc. in Computer Science,
9. 5-year integrated M.Sc. in Mathematics & Computing,
10. 5-year integrated M.Sc. in Physics (with specialization in Engineering Physics),
11. 5-year integrated M.Sc. in Statistics & Informatics.

### Group B

1. 5-year integrated M.A. in English,
2. 5-year integrated MBA (with specialization in Hospital, Retail, and Financial Management),
3. 5-year integrated M.Sc. in Geography,
4. 5-year integrated M.Sc. in Economics.

### Group C

1. 2-year M.A. in Bengali,
2. 2-year M.A. in English,
3. 2-year M.A. in Geography,
4. 2-year M.A. in History (with specialization in Islamic History),
5. 2-year M.A./M.Sc. in Journalism and Mass Communication (M.JMC).

## 3 PATTERN OF AUAT

There will be two papers. Paper-I will be of one hour duration on English, Islamic Studies and General



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Knowledge (in the ratio of approximately 2:1:1). For Group A, Paper-II will be of three hours duration on Physics, Chemistry, and Mathematics (in the ratio of approximately 1:1:2). For Group B (except MBA) & Group C (except M.JMC), Paper-II will be of three hours duration on the concerned subject. For MBA and M.JMC, Paper-II will be of three hours duration on basic mathematics, verbal and non-verbal reasoning and elementary knowledge in concerned area.

Questions in all papers will be of objective type in English and Bengali in multiple-choice format, which are to be answered on a specially designed machine-gradable sheet (ORS - Optical Response Sheet) using Black Ball pen only.

## 4. SYLLABUS

English for Paper-I: Basic knowledge of grammar and comprehension, vocabularies at 10+2 level; General knowledge for Paper-I: This will comprise History (Medieval and Modern India), Geography, Political Science, General Science & Current Affairs; Islamic Studies for Paper-I: Basic knowledge in Islamic History & Culture.

For Paper-II, Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics in Group A & English/ Geography in Group B (except MBA): As per the syllabus of Classes XI and XII of West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education (WBCHSE).

For Paper-II in Group C (except M.JMC): As per syllabus of 3-year Bachelor Degree Courses of Indian Universities (UGC model curriculum may be followed).

## 5. SCHEDULE OF AUAT-2012

The written test for Group A and Group B will be held on 22.04.2012 as per the schedule given below:

## 6. RESERVATION OF SEATS

### 6.1 Physically Disadvantaged (PD) Candidates

For candidates belonging to the PD category, who are otherwise fit to pursue the course and qualify in AUAT-2012 with relaxed norms relevant to this category, 3% seats are reserved as specified by the Government of India. For any category of disability (viz., orthopedic, visual, speech, and/or hearing), benefit would be given to those candidates who have at least 40% permanent physical impairment in relation to a body part/system/extremity/ extremities/ whole body, etc.

The candidates in this category will be required to submit a certificate of impairment from appropriate authority.

NB: The category of a candidate other than PD is hereby termed as GE category.



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## 6.2 Students from outside West Bengal

5% of seats are available to eligible candidates from outside the State of West Bengal but they have to appear in and qualify AUAT-2012.

## 6.3 Foreign students

A limited number of seats will be available to foreign students with requisite background, subject to the clearance from the Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India-also they have to appear in and qualify AUAT-2012.

## 7. ELIGIBILITY

A candidate has to satisfy all the eligibility conditions given below:

1. Candidates applying for AUAT-2012 should have pass / expected to pass the qualifying examination listed in Section 7.1 before / in 2012 and should satisfy the eligibility criteria listed in Section 7.2.
2. Candidates should meet the age requirements given in Section 7.4.

### 7.1 Qualifying Examination

Candidates applying for AUAT-2012 under Group A & Group B should have either completed or should be appearing in 2012 in any one of the following qualifying examinations.

1. The final examination of the 10+2 system, conducted by any recognized Central/ State Board, such as West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Examination, West Bengal Board of Madrasah Education, Central Board of Secondary Education (New Delhi), Council for Indian School Certificate Examination, etc.
2. Intermediate or two-year Pre-University Examination conducted by a recognized Board/ University.
3. Final Examination of the two-year course of the Joint Services Wing of the National Defense Academy.
4. General Certificate of Education (GEC) Examination (London/ Cambridge/ Sri Lanka) at the Advanced (A) level.
5. High School Certificate Examination of the Cambridge University.
6. Any Public School/ Board/ University Examination in India or in any foreign country recognized by the Association of Indian Universities as equivalent to the 10+2 system.
7. Senior Secondary School Examination conducted by the National Open School with a minimum of five subjects or H. S. Examination Conducted by W. B. Rabindra Mukta Vidyalay Samsad.
8. 3 or 4-year Diploma recognized by AICTE or State Board of Technical Education.

For Group A, candidates must have taken Chemistry, Mathematics and Physics at least 100 Marks each in the final exam of the 10+2 course.

For Group B, candidates appearing for 5-year integrated M.A. in English must have taken English at least 100 Marks and the candidates appearing for 5-year integrated M.Sc. in Geography must have taken Geography at least 100 Marks in the final exam of the 10+2 course.

Candidates appearing for AUAT-2012 under Group C (except M.JMC) should have either completed or should be appearing in 2012 in the concerned subject as Honours or Major or equivalent from any UGC recognized university. Candidates appearing for M.JMC in Group C, should have either completed or should be appearing in 2012 in any subject as Honours or Major or equivalent from any UGC recognized university.

### 7.2 Eligibility Criteria in Qualifying Examination

For all the Groups, a candidate has to obtain an aggregate of at least 45% marks or equivalent grade in 10 point scale in the qualifying examination.





Also for the courses under Group A, candidates belonging to the GE Category must secure at least an aggregate of 45% marks (or equivalent grade in a ten-point scale) in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics. For candidates belonging to PD category, eligibility criteria are relaxed by 5% in their Qualifying Examination. The Percentage of marks awarded by the Board will be treated as final. If the Board does not award the percentage of marks, for Group A and Group B, it has to be calculated on the basis of the best four combinations and for Group C, it will be calculated based on the marks obtained in all subjects listed in the mark sheet. If any Board awards only letter grades without providing an equivalent percentage of marks on the grade sheet, the candidate should obtain a certificate from the Board specifying the equivalent marks and submit it to the authority. Regarding his/her eligibility decision of AUAT - Committee shall be final.

### 7.3 Important Notes

1. Those candidates who will appear in the qualifying examination in 2013 or later are not eligible to apply for AUAT-2012
2. All provisional admissions to candidates who are appearing in the qualifying examination in the year 2012 will stand cancelled, if the proof of having passed the Qualifying Examination, as per the eligibility criteria specified in Section 7.2 is not submitted to the AUAT office by June 30, 2012
3. If a Board normally declares the results of the qualifying examination after 30.06.2012, students of such Boards are advised to attempt AUAT in the following year.
4. All admissions are subject to verification of facts from the original certificates/ documentations of the candidates. If an applicant is found ineligible at a later date even after admission to a course, his/her admission will be cancelled. The decision of the authority regarding the eligibility of any applicant shall be final.

### 7.4 Age Limit

For Group A and Group B courses, maximum age limit is 22 years as on 01-01-2012. For Group C courses, maximum age limit is 25 years as on 01.01.2012.

### 7.5 Physical Fitness

All qualified candidates may be required to submit a Physical Fitness Certificate from a Registered Medical Practitioner in the prescribed format that will be made available to them at an appropriate time. They will be admitted only if they are physically fit for pursuing a course of study at Aliah University.

A candidate opted for a particular centre may not be allocated to that center. However, he/ she may be allocated a nearby centre.

For Group C, the test will be conducted only at the Saltlake campus of the University.

### 9 ADMIT CARD

Admit Cards for the examination will be sent by Registered Post / Speed Post by first week of April, 2012 only to those eligible candidates, who have submitted valid Application Forms, complete in all respects, on or before the last date of submission of the same.

The University will not be responsible for any postal delay or irregularity resulting in non-delivery of Admit Card. In case of non-receipt of the Admit Card due to postal delay, Duplicate Admit Card will be issued only from the University office four working days before the commencement of the examination, on production of the acknowledgement card.

The Admit Card will bear the Name, Photograph, Signature, Date of Birth, Address, and Category of the candidate along with Name and Address of the Examination Centre allocated. The candidate should carefully examine the Admit Card received by him/ her for all the entries made therein. In case of any discrepancy, the candidate should inform the issuing office immediately.

### 10 MERIT LIST

#### 10.1 Ranking and Admission

Separate merit lists will be prepared for each Group on the basis of scores in the written test. A separate merit list will also be prepared for the Physically Disadvantage (PD) candidates. Qualified candidates whose names would appear in the merit list will be called for an interview. Final Merit lists will be made on the basis of scores in written test as well as interview. Admission to different courses will be made through counseling according to the rank in final merit list.

#### 10.2 Verification of Identity and Interview

The main purpose of asking the qualified candidates to appear in person for the interview is to verify their identity and aptitude. Hence the candidates must bring their Admit Cards and various other documents for verification of their identity of Age, Mark Sheet of Qualifying Examinations, and category, all in original with two attested photocopies of each. On failing to establish the authenticity of any of the above documents, the candidate will not be considered for interview and counseling.

### 11. PERFORMANCE IN AUAT-2012

The machine gradable Optical Response Sheets (ORS) are graded and scrutinized with extreme care. There is no provision for re-totalling. No photocopies of the Machine Gradable Sheets will be made available.

### 12 OTHER INFORMATION RELATED TO APPLICATION FORM

#### 12.1 Where and How to Send Your Completed Application Form

Duly completed Application Form should be folded only along the indicated line and inserted in the envelope supplied. You should not staple or paste together the Application Form, the attested copy of the 10th class or equivalent examination pass Certificate, and the Acknowledge Card.

The envelope containing the Application Form and the Acknowledge Card must be sent to The Chairman, AUAT-2012, Aliah University, DN- 47, Sector-V, Salt Lake, Kolkata- 700091, by Registered Post / Speed Post. You may also submit your completed application in person at the AUAT office.



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## 12.2 Deadline for Receipt of the Completed Application Form

The last date for receipt of the completed application at the AUAT Office is 27.02.2012. Any application received after this date will not be accepted. Any delay in receiving the application material by the candidate will not be considered as a valid reason for the late submission of the completed application after the deadline. The University will not accept responsibility for any postal delay or irregularity or loss during postal transit.

## 12.3 Proof of Sending the Completed Application

No claim of submission of the application will be entertained unless the Acknowledgement Card supports it. No correspondence with regard to the application, eligibility, and Admit Card will be entertained unless the application number is quoted. If the Acknowledgement Card does not reach you by End of March, 2012, you must check with the AUAT Office, where your application was sent to. Telephone numbers are given on the back cover of this brochure.

You have furnished an attested copy of the 10th class or equivalent Examination pass certificate or the Admit Card of class X (as age proof certificate), third copy of the Bank's pay-in-slip / Photo copy of money receipt by the University (if form collected from AUAT office) and the Acknowledgement Card along with the Application Form in the envelope provided. Do not paste or staple them with the form.
4. You have retained a Photo copy of the duly filled in Application Form.

## 14 IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS

1. Write in capital letters the required information with black ink in the boxes (wherever provided).
2. Do not scribble, smudge, cut, tear, or wrinkle the Application Form. Do not put any stray pencil marks anywhere on the Application Form.
3. Your photograph, signature, and address shall be scanned by a machine that recognizes only good quality images and from only the specified areas of the form. Write your name (with ball point pen only) on the reverse side of a good quality coloured photograph (3.5 cm x 4.5 cm), taken not more than two months earlier, and paste it in the box provided.
