A candidate must be a citizen of India as defined in Articles 5 & 6 of the Constitution of India and must be a holder of Degree in Law of a recognized University.

The candidates shall have to appear in a Preliminary Examination (Screening test) of objective questions of 100 marks out of which 90 marks will cover General knowledge, Aptitude, intelligence, Test of Comprehension and expression of Law, English ,Constitution of India, Code of Civil Procedure, Code of Criminal Procedure, Transfer of Property Act, Limitation Act, Indian Penal Code, Evidence Act, Legal Theories of Jurisprudence, Arbitration & Conciliation Act, Indian Contract Act, Family Law, Specific Relief Act, Motor Vehicle Act, Industrial & Labour Law, Land Acquisition Act, Law Relating to Trust, Indian Registration Act , Court Fees Act and remaining 10 marks to test the proficiency in Official Language(s) of the state of Assam and those candidates who will secure 60% or more marks shall be eligible for appearing in the Main ( written) examination. For the Main (written) examination 10 candidates will be called against 1 vacancy (1:10). Successful candidates in the Main (written) examination shall be called for Interview/Viva Voce. more aggregate marks subject to obtaining 40 percent marks in individual paper I, II & III and minimum 35% marks in the language paper shall be eligible for Viva-Voce Examination. This would be subject to the ratio of 1:3. In the Viva-Voce out of 50 marks the candidates will have to secure minimum 60% marks. The final selection shall be made subject to overall suitability.



This would be subject to the ratio of 1:3. In the Viva-Voce out of 50 marks the candidates will have to secure minimum 60% marks. The final selection shall be made subject to overall suitability.

On selection, the candidates shall have to undergo Pre-Appointment Training as per Rules.

Candidates selected to undergo the training course will have to qualify in an examination to be conducted by the concerned institute/School/Academy, on completion of the course.
