Applications are invited from <u>unmarried Indian citizens</u> (<u>Men & Women</u>) for Short Service Commission (SSC) as <u>PILOT/OBSERVER</u> in the Executive Branch of the Indian Navy for Course commencing <u>Jun 2012</u> at the Indian Naval Academy Ezhimala, Kerala.

ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS

- 2. Age. 19 to 23 years born between 02 Jul 1989 and 01 Jul 1993; both dates inclusive.
- Note. Applicants who have <u>FAILED</u> in PABT (Pilot Aptitude Battery Test) earlier are not eligible for Pilot Entry, but can apply for the Observer Entry Scheme.
- 3. Educational Qualifications

A graduate degree in any discipline with minimum 60% marks. Should have qualified Mathematics & Physics at 10+2 level.

4. The gender requirement is as follows:-

- <u>Note:</u>-(a) Candidates who have not completed their Degree (i.e. appearing candidates) need not apply.

Physical Standards

- 5. (a) <u>Height and Weight.</u> Minimum height for men162.5 cms and for women 152 cm with correlated weight, leg length, sitting height and thigh length.
 - (b) **Eye Sight**. The minimum acceptable vision standard for distant vision 6/6, 6/9 correctable to 6/6, 6/6. Should not be colour/night blind.

<u>Note:</u>- There will be no relaxation in Physical Standards.

INDUCTION AND TRAINING

- 6. Candidates will be inducted under Short Service Commission Scheme. Short Service Commission is granted for a term of 10 years, extendable to 14 years, subject to service requirement and performance/willingness of the candidate. On completion of these tenures, officers are entitled for gratuity under the extant rules. The Officers will be on probation for a period of two years, during which they are liable to be discharged if their performance is unsatisfactory.
- 7. Pilot Entry. Pilot candidates will be inducted as Cadets and undergo Naval Orientation Course at the Indian Naval Academy, Ezhimala. This will be followed by Stage I and Stage-II flying training at the Air Force Academy/Naval establishments. On successful completion of Stage II training the Cadets will be awarded wings and commissioned as Sub-Lieutenants.
- 8. Observer Entry. Observer candidates will be inducted as an officer in the rank of Sub Lieutenant and undergo Naval Orientation Course at the Indian Naval Academy, Ezhimala, Kerala followed by professional training at various Naval Training Establishments/Units/Ships. Full pay and allowances are admissible to officers whilst under training.
- 9. <u>Training.</u> The training is scheduled to commence in the month of <u>Jun 2012</u>. Only unmarried candidates are eligible to undergo training. Any candidate who is found to be married or marries while under training will be discharged and shall be liable to <u>REFUND</u> full pay & allowances drawn by him/her and expenditure incurred on him/her by the Government.

<u>IMPORTANT</u> - Officers inducted under these schemes will not be given extension beyond fourteen years and will not be eligible for permanent commission.

HOWTO APPLY

10. Candidates have to submit application online only for this entry. Receipt of multiple applications from the same candidates will result in <u>cancellation of his/her candidature</u>. The candidates applying online (e-application) can do so from <u>05 Oct 11</u>. The online application registration will cease on <u>31 Oct 11</u>.

 Whilst filling up the e-application, it is advisable to keep the relevant documents readily available to enable the following:
 - (a) Correct filling up of personal particulars, details are to be filled up as given in the Matriculation Certificate.
 - (b) Fields such as e-mail address, Mobile number are mandatory fields and need to be filled.
 - 2. <u>Filling up of e-application:</u> For filling up application Online visit our website <u>www.nausena-bharti.nic.in</u> and proceed as follows:
 - and proceed as follows:
 (a) Click in the 'Officer Entry' button under the option 'Apply Online' on the **Home Page.**
 - (b) Fill the online registration form. Tips to assist in filling up fields have been provided as you highlight each field.
 - (c) Before Clicking the Submit button it should be checked whether all the details entered in the form are correct as you will not be able to make any corrections after saving the record.
 - (d) After submitting the form, a 'Roll Number' will be generated by the system and displayed on the screen. This Roll Number will automatically appear on the printout of the form. If the system does not generate the Roll Number, it is an indication of non-acceptance of Application by the system.
 - (e)_You are to take the printout of the online application form with system generated Roll Number and produce it at the time of SSB (If shortlisted). Your application is subject to the scrutiny at SSB and can be rejected if found **ineligible** at any point of time.

SELECTION PROCEDURE

- 13. (a) Candidates will be issued call up for Service Selection Board (SSB) interviews based on their performance in educational qualification. If a candidate possesses higher qualification with better percentage, his higher qualification will be considered for cut off. Integrated Headquarters, Ministry of Defence (Navy) reserves the right to short-list applications and to fix cut off percentage. No communication will be entertained on this account.
 - (b) SSB interviews for short-listed candidates will be scheduled from **March to June 2012** at Bangalore.
 - (c) The total duration of SSB interviews is five days, consisting of stage I (Day one) and stage II (Four days). Stage I Tests, consist of Intelligence Tests, Picture Perception and Group Discussion Tests.Candidates who fail to qualify in StageI will be sent back on the same day from SSB Centre. Stage II Tests consists of Psychological Tests, Group Task Tests and Interview. Successful candidates will undergo the following:
 - (i) <u>For Pilot</u> PABT (Pilot Aptitude Battery Tests) followed by Aviation Medical examination.
 - (ii) For Observer Aviation Medical examination
 - (d) Candidates recommended by the SSBs, cleared PABT (for Pilot Entry) and declared medically fit will be appointed for training based on merit list and depending on the number of vacancies available.
 - (e) Change of SSB Centre for interview is not permissible.
 - (f) Any correspondence regarding change of SSB dates be addressed to the President of the SSB on receipt of call up letter and copy endorsed to Directorate of Manpower Planning & Recruitment (Ol&R), Room No 204, 'C' Wing. Sena Bhawan, IHQ-MoD (N), New Delhi- 110011 (Fax No 011-23011282)
 - (g) No compensation will be paid in respect of any injury sustained as a result of tests.
 - (h) Return 3rd AC rail fare is admissible for the SSB interview, if appearing for the first time for this entry.
- 14. Male candidates who do not clear PABT/Aviation medicals and have opted for Short Service Executive (General Service) will only be considered for the same, if qualified medically & educationally {BE/BTech/BSc(Phy & Maths)}. This is subject to availability of vacancies and on their position in the merit list.

DUTIES OF A PILOT OFFICER

15. On completion of basic flying training and on award of wings after commission, you would have an opportunity to fly Fixed Wing Aircraft or helicopters. This could be from an aircraft carrier, other ships decks or from an airfield ashore. You would be flying machines at the cutting edge of technology. You would actively participate in all facets of Naval Operations, i.e. Air, surface and sub-surface operations. An honorable, exciting & adventurous life awaits you as a Pilot in the Navy.

DUTIES OF AN OBSERVER OFFICER

16. On completion of training, you would be part of the Indian Naval Aviation Arm. Your primary task would be to operate various state of the art equipment including sonics, sonars, radars and communication equipment. You would get an opportunity to participate in all facets of Naval operations onboard the "eyes of the fleet" the Maritime Patrol aircraft.

THE NAVY OFFERS YOU

17. Pay Scale & Promotions. The promotion from Sub Lieutenant to Commander is on time scale basis and thereafter on selection basis subject to fulfillment of requisite service condition. The Pay Scale and promotion criteria is as follows:-

- 19. Cost to Company (CTC). The CTC for a sub Lieutenant would be approximately Rs. 77,000/- per month. This includes Basic Pay, DA, Grade Pay, Military Service Pay, Flying Allowance, House Rent Allowance and Transport allowance. These rates are not statutory and are subject to change.
- 20. <u>Privileges.</u> In addition to the CTC mentioned above, Navy provides Free Medical Facilities for Self & dependents, Canteen Facilities, Entitled Ration, Mess/Club/Sports Facilities, Furnished Govt. Accommodation, Car/Housing Loan at subsidised rate.
- 21. **Group Insurance & Gratuity.** Insurance cover of Rs. 40 lakhs (on contribution) and Gratuity will be granted to the officer as per the latest rules in force.
- 22. Leave Entitlements. On Commission, officers are entitled to 60 days annual and 20 days casual leave every year (subject to service exigencies). They are also entitled for 40% rail concession to any place and free travel (as per extant rules) for self and family. Leave during training period will be as per the Training Policy in force.
- 23. <u>Sports & Adventure</u>. The Navy provides facilities to pursue any sport of your liking. In addition, one can learn and participate in adventure sports, such as river rafting, mountaineering, hot air ballooning, hang gliding, wind surfing etc.
- 24. <u>Physical Fitness.</u> In Naval Academy curriculum, a lot of emphasis is laid on physical fitness. You are therefore, advised to remain fit through physical exercises, sports, running, swimming, etc. so that you meet the training goals successfully.
