These tribals were mistakenly described as 'cannibals' by Marco Polo.

These tribes are known to be extraordinary in sensing the natural disasters, like tsunami, beforehand.

Unfortunately, colonization proved most disastrous for these precious tribes. When the British arrived on these islands, the Great Andamanese were a people of more than 5,000; today, only about two dozen of them survive. The Onges were 670 in 1900's, but now they are 97. While the Jarawa and the Sentinelese are on the verge of extinction, the Jangil tribe is already extinct.

These tribes still practise ancient culture that is strange to most of us. Their major food is fruits, wild boar and some reptiles.

Slow advent of the settlers from various places and increased tourism has driven these unique people into the deep jungles. Scarcity of food, diseases and their cultural traditions have almost made them rare.

These simple people are now being taken care of by the Government. Let us wait and see how long we can sustain one of the earliest human tribes on our land.
